From next April there will be more changes. Kitchen food waste is to be sent to make 'green' methane. Households will get a kitchen 'caddy' and a bin outside.

Open spaces at risk from 'green wedge' review

The City Council asked 'experts' to assess the value of Derby's green wedges for Derby's new 'Local Plan'. The report is now published on the Council's website at: tinyurl.com/DCC-GBWs



Green wedges help shape Derby's communities, provide space for wildlife and create links into the countryside. The review says that the Heatherton-Oaklands green wedge could give up some space without too much harm. This is being quoted in the recently submitted application for 350 homes. The report also says that the housing proposed near Staker Lane in South Derbyshire damages the green wedge between Littleover and Mickleover.

Cllr **Lucy Care** said "This report could see the end of some of Derby's green open space. Land like this is wanted by developers for new homes. Government housing targets make it hard for Councils to say 'No' to housing developers.

"However the report could also provide evidence to challenge the new housing near Staker Lane in South Derbyshire. Do get in touch to discuss this."

Only Labour has a say on Derby's future

Although the Government will decide the shape of Derby's new, larger Council, all councillors had expected to have a vote. But no.

Government rules mean that only the Cabinet councillors - all Labour - will have a vote. Full Council will only be consulted.

The Mayor and Littleover councillor, Ajit Atwal, said "This pushes the fate of our local democracy even further from local voters. The whole process is being rushed through without giving time to improve the way it is being done."

In addition it has now been made clear that councillors elected in 2023 will be in post for five years, not the usual four. There will still be elections in 2027, for a new 'shadow' Council and these councillors will also service for five years, till 2032.

Lib Dem Group leader, Councillor **Lucy Care** said "Letting local people have a say in local democracy seems to be less and less part of the Labour Government's agenda."

Schools being forced into Academies

If schools were struggling, Councils used to be blamed. People could vote differently at the next local election.

Then the Government introduced a range of types of school, and schools started to opt out of Council 'control'. More and more schools are getting support from 'academy chains', not the local Council. These provide advice and support services as Councils did, but voters have no say if it isn't going right.

Now the Labour Government has told a nearby primary school that it must leave Council oversight and join an Academy. This also means that the land and buildings transfer from being a public asset to private.

At a time when pupil numbers are expected to fall, this could mean that school land is sold, not kept or used for public benefit.

Labour promised in their manifesto not to sell off the NHS. We need to protect our schools too!

News on help for roads

Each year, councillors in Derby used to choose two small highways projects. This year they have been asked to choose just one larger one, that might last up to three years.

Highways engineers have been advising on these choices, as they have to agree with the regional mayor's priorities.

The still new 'regional mayor' is head of the East Midlands Combined County Authority (EMCCA). EMCCA is taking over transport roles from the City Council. This is due to be complete by next April.

Cllr **Lucy Care** said "We are told that Derby is planning to submit a transport request from each of the wards to be funded by the EMCCA mayor. Whether they will all get approved, or not, we wait to hear."

After careful discussion, Littleover's choice is still the same as two years ago. This is to consider the streets south of **Burton Road**, from **Warwick Avenue** to **Hillsway**. This area has many complaints about speeding and road safety.

Cllr **Ajit Atwal** said "It was a difficult choice. We needed to choose a project with the best chance of getting funded. Other areas with problems, like **Rykneld Road** or near the

Royal Derby Hospital could get improvements funded from housing developers or being part of a larger scheme covering major roads."

Cllrs **Lucy Care** and **Ajit Atwal** at the edge of city. Issues here may be easier to solve after 2028 when the Council boundary goes.
