# The Council, 2023/24

Derby City Council again has no one party with a majority of councillors. At the AGM the largest party - now Labour - was allowed by other councillors to elect one of their own as leader. He then chose other Labour councillors to form the 'Cabinet' which makes most of the decisions.

To balance the Labour Cabinet, chairs and vice chairs of committees are from other parties. This means there is a little bit more oversight over what Labour do.

The mayor is a non-political role in Derby. The **Lib Dem** councillors were unhappy with both the proposed candidates and didn't attend that part of the meeting.

### City Centre development

Do you go to the city centre less than you used to?

Many people are now doing more shopping on line or at retail parks, like Kingsway, which are easy to drive to.

Together this means that the city centre needs less space for shops and is needing to reinvent itself. Owners of city-centre land are starting to think about 'what next?' for empty buildings and land.

The Council has been asked if the warehouse shops on Bradshaw Way could be replaced. The request is for a small group of tall buildings including homes and offices as well as a few shops.

The proposed height - taller than the cathedral - has been a talking point. At present only 'outline', or 'in principle', approval has been given.

Cllr **Lucy Care** who is on the Council's Planning Committee said "Most important are the quality of the design and the build. What goes there needs to do Derby justice, both from close up and from further away. I don't want a cluster of boring blocks like the grey box on Derbion. I also want to know how tall buildings can also be 'low carbon'." Partygate Report says Boris Johnson misled Parliament

Cllr **Lucy Care** said "We've had problems in previous years, but not this bad. When we complained, we were told that the extra Bank Holidays didn't help, and there had been budget cuts.

"Budget cuts and Bank Holidays could be planned for. We are

asking for better planning and publicity next year."

#### **Middleton Avenue shops**

Councillors have been told that the planning application for shops and flats on the corner of **Middleton Avenue** will be refused. However this is not yet showing on the Council's website.

#### **Uttoxeter New Road repairs**

The uneven road surface from the Hospital roundabout to the ring road is going to be renewed. Work will be done during the middle of the day (9:30 - 3:30) from 19<sup>th</sup> June to 7<sup>th</sup> July. Diversion routes using the trunk roads will be signed.

# **Highways priorities**

The Council is changing the way that Highways works with local areas. They are moving away from councillors being able to suggest a couple of priorities for their wards each year. Instead wards will be helped to think longer term to solve highways and transport problems.

Littleover has already identified the area from **Hillsway** to the ring road as needing work to reduce problems like speed and cut through traffic at many points. Councillors are still waiting to hear

when and how work on this area will start.

Meanwhile they are pushing to get previous priorities solved. This includes over-running on North Street pavements and reducing crashes at **Callow Hill Way** roundabout.
